**Duty of Love to the Members of the Church (Brotherly Love)**  
**Part 6**

This is part 6 of the duty of the members to love one another, otherwise known as brotherly love. I stopped on page 12 at number 125.

1. **COVID-19 Plague Update** – The COVID-19 pandemic continues. The plague in the U.S. started in March of 2020 and is now in its 29 month. That is already longer than anyone predicted when it started. In July when I preached last we were around 120,000 cases a day and we are still at that. But, no one believes those are good numbers because at home tests don't count in the official tally. I have seen more cases in June, July and August than I did in January when we were over 1,000,000 cases a day. The total count in the U.S. is 92,000,000 cases and just over 1,030,000 deaths. World cases are 590,000,000 and 6,500,000 deaths. Eph 5:3 *But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; 4 Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks 5 For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. 6 Let no man deceive you with vain words: **for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience.** 7 Be not ye therefore partakers with them. 8 For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:*

2. **Abortion** – On Aug. 2, 2022, the voters of Kansas overwhelmingly voted to retain the state constitutional right to murder babies. The murderers have spoken. They will have no restraint on the slaughter of the unborn. God Almighty is the avenger of blood. Rom 12:9 *Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord. De 32:41 If I whet my glittering sword, and mine hand take hold on judgment; I will render vengeance to mine enemies, and will reward them that hate me.* Of the 105 counties in Kansas, only 18 voted against the constitutional amendment to ban abortion (87 voted for it). The final result was 41% (378,466) for the constitutional amendment to ban abortion and 59% (543,855) against it. A record was made that day! The LORD put it right to you whether you support or oppose abortion and that record will be used against them. We live in a bloody state beloved!

Shall not the God of all the earth visit for this? Re 21:8 *But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death.*



3. **MoneyPox** – Last week President Biden declared a national health emergency – not over COVID but over Monekeypox. It first appeared in the U.K. on May 6, 2022, from a person with travel ties to Nigeria. This is the first time monkeypox has spread widely outside Africa. There are now 25,000 cases worldwide. According to NPR: *So far, there have been more than 6,616 cases detected in the U.S., but that is likely an undercount. Most cases in the U.S. are concentrated in the [practicing sodomite] community, “primarily among men who have sex with other men” is how the media likes to put it. In the current outbreak, the vast majority of people appear to be catching the virus from sexual contact.* The U.S. started with 20 cases back in May! CNN says: *The vast majority of those who have been diagnosed to date with human monkeypox are self-identifying men who have sex with other man. This is likely due to shared sexual networks. ... Just like other diseases, there’s no reason it can’t spread to other communities via sexual or other close contact.* On July 28, 2022, the WHO Director General advised MSM (men who have sex with men) to limit exposure by reducing the number of sexual partners, and maintain contact details (anonymous sodomitical sex is bad) to allow for epidemiological follow-up. Fred Sr. said sodomites are libidinous (showing excessive sexual drive, lustful). Ro 1:27 *And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and receiving in themselves that recompence of their error which was meet.*

Barnes: Ver. 27. And likewise the men, etc. The sin which is here specified is that which was the shameful sin of Sodom, and which from that has been called sodomy. It would scarcely be credible that man had been guilty of a crime so base and so degrading, unless there was

ample and full testimony to it. **Perhaps there is no sin which so deeply shows the depravity of man as this...** It has been indeed a matter of controversy whether pederasty, (sexual activity involving a man and a boy or youth) or the love of boys, among the ancients, was not a pure and harmless love, but the evidence is against it. ... The crime with which the apostle charges the Gentiles here was by no means confined to the lower classes of the people. It doubtless pervaded all classes, and we have distinct specifications of its existence in a great number of cases. Maximus Tyrius says, that in the time of Socrates this vice was common among the Greeks; and is at pains to vindicate Socrates from it as almost a solitary exception. He also says, that the practice was common among the Greeks, and that their poets and great men, and even their learned men and philosophers, not only practiced, but gloried in it. And he adds, that it was the custom, not of particular cities only, but of Greece in general. Xenophon says, that “the unnatural love of boys is so common, that in many places it is established by the public laws.” Plato says that the Cretans practiced this crime, and justified themselves by the example of Jupiter and Ganymede. And Aristotle says, that among the Cretans there was a law encouraging that sort of unnatural love. Tit 1:12 *One of themselves, even a prophet of their own, said, The Cretians are always liars, evil beasts, slow bellies.* Evil Beasts = unrestrained indulgence of wild and ferocious passions; slow bellies = gluttonous and slothful.

Plutarch says, that this was practiced at Thebes, and at Elis. He further says, that Solon, the great lawgiver of Athens, “was not proof against beautiful boys, and had not courage to resist the force of love.” Diogenes Laertius says that this vice was practiced by the stoic Zeno. Among the Romans, to whom Paul was writing, this vice was no less common. Cicero introduces, without any mark of disapprobation, Cotta, a man of the first rank and genius, freely and familiarly owning to other Romans of the same quality, that this worse than beastly vice was practiced by himself and quoting the authority of ancient philosophers in vindication of it. **It appears from what Seneca says, that in his time it was practiced openly at Rome, and without shame. He speaks of flocks and troops of boys, distinguished by their colours and nations** (human trafficking); **and says that great care was taken to train them up for this detestable employment.** There is not the least evidence that this abominable vice was confined to Greece and Rome. If so common there — if it had the sanction even of their philosophers — it may be presumed that it was practiced elsewhere, and that the sin against nature was a common crime throughout the heathen world. Navarrete, in his account of the empire of China, says that it is extremely common among the Chinese. And there is every reason to believe that, both in the old world and the new, this abominable crime is still practiced. If such was the state of the pagan world, then surely the argument of the apostle

is well sustained, that there was need of some other plan of salvation (as you cannot practice this sin and expect salvation) than was taught by the light of nature.

Unseemly = shameful or disgraceful.

**And receiving in themselves**, etc. The meaning of this doubtless is, that the effect of such base and unnatural passions was to enfeeble the body, to produce premature old age, disease, decay, and an early death. That this is the effect of the indulgence of licentious passions, is amply proved by the history of man. The despots who practice polygamy, and keep harems in the east, are commonly superannuated at forty years of age; and it is well known, even in Christian countries, that the effect of licentious indulgence is to break down and destroy the constitution. How much more might this be expected to follow the practice of the vice specified in the verse under examination! God has marked the indulgence of licentious passions with his frown. **Since the time of the Romans and the Greeks, as if there had not been sufficient restraints before, he has originated a new disease**, which is one of the most loathsome and distressing which has ever afflicted man, and which has swept off millions of victims. **But the effect on the body was not all. It tended to debase the mind; to sink man below the level of the brute; to destroy the sensibility; and to “sear the conscience as with a hot iron.”** The last remnant of reason and conscience, it would seem, must be extinguished in those who would indulge in this unnatural and degrading vice.

Eph 5:3 *But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints; 4 Neither filthiness, nor foolish talking, nor jesting, which are not convenient: but rather giving of thanks 5 For this ye know, that no whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God. 6 Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience. 7 Be not ye therefore partakers with them. 8 For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light.*

### **Lord's Supper -**

*1 Cor. 11:17 ¶ Now in this that I declare unto you I praise you not, that ye come together not for the better, but for the worse. 18 For first of all, when ye come together in the church, I hear that there be divisions among you; and I partly believe it. 19 For there must be also heresies among you, that they which are approved may be made manifest among you. 20 When ye come together therefore into one place, this is not to eat the Lord's supper. 21 For in eating every one taketh before other his own supper: and one is hungry, and another is*

drunken. 22 What? have ye not houses to eat and to drink in? or despise ye the church of God, and shame them that have not? What shall I say to you? shall I praise you in this? I praise you not. 23 ¶ For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, That the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: 24 And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. 25 After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, This cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. 26 For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come. 27 Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. 28 But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup. 29 For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. 30 For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep. 31 For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged. 32 But when we are judged, we are chastened of the Lord, that we should not be condemned with the world. 33 Wherefore, my brethren, when ye come together to eat, tarry one for another. 34 And if any man hunger, let him eat at home; that ye come not together unto condemnation. And the rest will I set in order when I come.

Doing your duty to love one another according to the requirements of God is not a spectator sport. You have to be engaged in action. Discreet action.

Arthur Pink in the *Redeemer's Return* says: **The HOPE of our Lord's second advent produces loyalty and faithfulness to Christ.** Mat. 24:44 - Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh. 45 Who then is a faithful and wise servant, whom his lord hath made ruler over his household, to give them meat in due season? 46 Blessed is that servant, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so doing. 47 Verily I say unto you, That he shall make him ruler over all his goods. 48 But and if that evil servant shall say in his heart, My lord delayeth his coming; 49 And shall begin to smite his fellow-servants, and to eat and drink with the drunken; 50 The lord of that servant shall come in a day when he looketh not for him, and in an hour that he is not aware of, 51 And shall cut him asunder, and appoint him his portion with the hypocrites: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. **The moral purpose of the parable is apparent. While the steward maintained an attitude of watchfulness he was faithful and sober, but when he said in his heart "my Lord delayeth his coming" he began to beat his fellow-servants and to eat and drink and be drunken.**

Watching for the Lord then is an incentive to loyalty and fidelity, while unwatchfulness results in worldliness of heart, carelessness of walk and carnality of life.

**The Return of our Lord is presented as a motive to brotherly love – 1 Thes. 3: 12 *And the Lord make you to increase and abound in love one toward another, and toward all men, even as we do toward you: 13 To the end he may stablish your hearts unblameable in holiness before God, even our Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all his saints. In view of the fact that our Lord Jesus Christ may return at any hour, how awful are divisions between the Lord's own people. SOON SHALL EACH OF US APPEAR BEFORE THE BEMA (ALTAR) OF CHRIST WHERE EVERY WRONG WILL BE RIGHTED AND EVERY MISUNDERSTANDING CLEARED UP. THE LORD IS AT HAND, THEREFORE LET US SINK OUR PETTY DIFFERENCES, FORGIVE ONE ANOTHER EVEN AS GOD HATH FOR CHRIST'S SAKE FORGIVEN US AND INCREASED AND BOUND IN LOVE ONE TOWARD ANOTHER.***

Consider Mat. 5:23 *Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee;*

*24 Leave there thy gift before the altar, and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift.*

James 1:22 *But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. 23 For if any be a hearer of the word, and not a doer, he is like unto a man beholding his natural face in a glass: 24 For he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of man he was. 25 But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth therein, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed. 26 If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain. 27 Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.*

Isaiah 33:10 *Now will I rise, saith the LORD; now will I be exalted; now will I lift up myself. 11 Ye shall conceive chaff, ye shall bring forth stubble: your breath, as fire, shall devour you. 12 And the people shall be as the burnings of lime: as thorns cut up shall they be burned in the fire. 13 Hear, ye that are far off, what I have done; and, ye that are near, acknowledge my might. 14 The sinners in Zion are afraid; fearfulness hath surprised the hypocrites. Who*

*among us shall dwell with the devouring fire? who among us shall dwell with everlasting burnings?*

Rev. 3:1 And unto the angel of the church in Sardis write; These things saith he that hath the seven Spirits of God, and the seven stars; I know thy works, that thou hast a name that thou livest, and art dead. 2 Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die: for I have not found thy works perfect before God. 3 Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee.

4 Thou **hast a few names even in Sardis which have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with me in white: for they are worthy.** 5 He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life, but I will confess his name before my Father, and before his angels. 6 He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches.

*Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God – Jonathan Edwards, July 8, 1741 Their foot shall slide in due time – Deut. 32:35. In this verse is threatened the vengeance of God on the wicked and unbelieving Israelites, who were God’s visible people, and who lived under the means of grace; but who, notwithstanding all God’s wonderful works toward them, remained void of counsel, having no understanding in them. Under all the cultivations of heaven, they brought forth bitter and poisonous fruit. ..They are now the objects of that very same anger and wrath of God, that is expressed in the torments of hell. And the reason why they do not go down to hell at each moment, is not because God, in whose power they are, is not then very angry with them; as he is with many miserable creatures now tormented in hell, who there feel and bear the fierceness of this wrath. Yea, God is a great deal more angry with great numbers that are now on each; yea, doubtless, with many that are now in this congregation, who it may be are at ease, then he is with many of those who are now in the flames of hell.*
