

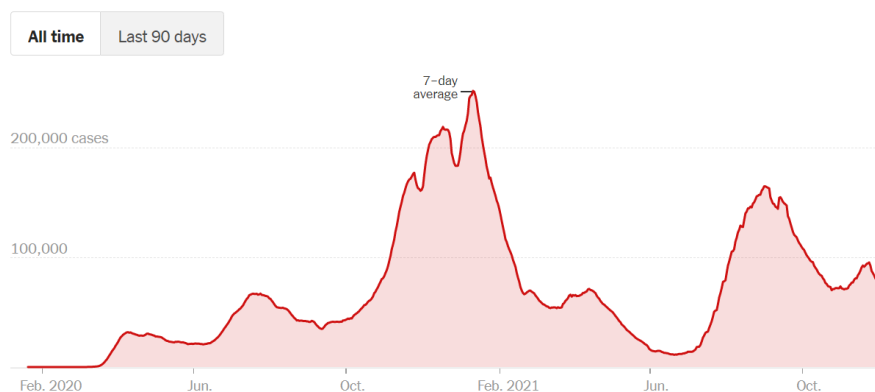

### Duty of Love to the Members of the Church (Brotherly Love)

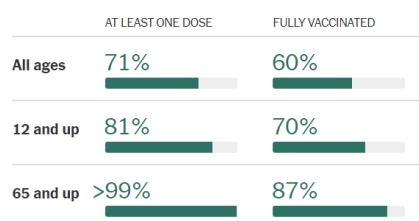
I am halting my sermons on Romans 12 for a few sermons, because I want to follow up my last sermon on Romans 12:9. I want to talk about the duties of the brethren in the church to one another. But before I do that, I have a few preliminary matters.

##### State of the virus

Update for Dec. 3

Psalm 106:29 *Thus they provoked him to anger with their inventions: **and the plague brake in upon them.*** Eze 38:22 ***And I will plead against him with pestilence and with blood; and I will rain upon him, and upon his bands, and upon the many people that are with him, an overflowing rain, and great hailstones, fire, and brimstone.*** Am 4:10 ***I have sent among you the pestilence after the manner of Egypt... I have made the stink of your camps to come up unto your nostrils: yet have ye not returned unto me, saith the LORD.***

On December 3, 2021, we had 149,151 new cases (or a weekly average of 100,000 new cases of COVID-19) in the U.S. 112,000+ new cases a day continues to be a big number. This is particularly true given that 60% of the population of the U.S. is fully vaccinated (and this number does not count the positive home tests that are being done). You might recall that we did not see 100,000 new cases a day in the U.S. until October 2020. And we continue to see break-through infections where people that are vaccinated are get sick and occasionally, even die (Colin Powell). They are not tracking break-through infections for the country (that I can find). In the state of Minnesota they are tracking this.

In Minnesota they have vaccinated 3.3 million people. Of that number they have had about 100,000 “breakthrough” infections (3%). Of that number there has been about 4,000 (0.120%) hospitalizations and 655 (0.020%) deaths. In the U.S. we are approaching 50,000,000 cases and 800,000 deaths. Globally those numbers are 270,00,000 cases and 5,400,000 deaths. About half the number of states now have the new Omicron variant that is supposed to be significantly more, even twice as transmissible as the Delta variant. In the US, there is an average of 1,200+ dying daily. That is a equivalent of a large high school. The plague and pestilence from God continues.

2. **Transgender Zeitgeist** – Dave Chappelle is a comedian, and he makes a lot of money at it. He has a special on Netflix called “The Closer.” Leaked internal documents show Netflix paid him \$24 million to do the special. In the special, among other things, he says “Gender is a fact.” He says it four or five times. He has taken a firestorm of criticism from the Sodomite community. Chappelle has not apologized for it and, Netflix has not taken it down. Netflix’s CEO says they will not take it down because it is so popular). Chappelle says he has another movie he did that is being blackballed and cancelled over the controversy. Transgenderism is not a social matter to the people of God. It is a religious and spiritual matter. The spirituality of this is uncontroverted. **This is inherently a Creation issue.**

*Isaiah 46:9 ...For I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me, 10 Declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure. Isaiah 44:6 Thus saith the LORD the King of Israel, and his redeemer the LORD of hosts; I am the first, and I am the last; and beside me there is no God. Daniel 4:35 And all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: and he doeth according to his will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou? Rom. 11:34 For who hath known the mind of the Lord? or who hath been his counsellor?*

*Ge 1:27 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created He him; **male and female created He them.** Ge 5:2 **Male and female created He them;** and blessed them, and called their name Adam, in the day when they were created. Mat 19:3 The Pharisees also came unto him, tempting him, and saying unto him, Is it lawful for a man to put away his wife for every cause? 4 And He (Jesus Christ – God, Savior*

and Judge) answered and said unto them, *Have ye not read, that He which made them at the beginning made them male and female, 5 And said, For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? 6 Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder.*

To be clear, when we encounter transgender human beings, non-binary, trans men, trans women on the picket line, in public, at work or anywhere else, our duty is to love our neighbor and treat them the way we want to be treated. Mat. 7:12 *Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets* (Christ). That said, we will not negotiate on the matter that gender is determined by God and chromosomes do not lie. Trying to change your gender is warring against the God of creation and it is sinful conduct.

- 3. Bob Dole** – Bob Dole died last week. He was 98. He was a U.S. Representative in Congress (from Kansas) from 1961 to 1969 and a U.S. Senator (from Kansas) from 1969 to 1996 (35 years). He was a power-broker both in the state and nationwide. He was a “prince” of this country. He served as U.S. Senate Majority Leader for 3 terms (11 years). He was the Presidential Nominee for the Republican Party in 1996 (he lost to Clinton). He was also a U.S. Vice Presidential candidate. He grew up in Russell, Kansas. He was recruited to KU to play basketball by none other than Phog Allen. He was on the basketball, track and football teams at KU. He joined the U.S. Army in 1942 and was seriously wounded by a German shell in WWII. The medics gave him the maximum amount of morphine they could give him and wrote an M on his forehead in his own blood so no one else would come later and give him more morphine and kill him. He was paralyzed and they thought he would die due to his injuries and massive infection. He sustained permanent injuries to his right arm, spine and back. But, the Lord saved him. He was also a lawyer. He married his first wife, Phyllis in 1948. She was an occupational therapist and nursed him to health and bore him a child. Except for the complete lack of any spiritual information on him (and that is really the only thing that counts to God – because God loaned him all of his gifts) – he was an impressive guy from a worldly standard. So far so good. He divorced Phyllis on January 11, 1972, in what Fred Sr. always said was an expedited divorce. His lawyer (a future judge) got a sitting judge to go into the courthouse after hours and got the job done. No waiting

period, just done. You know what the Lord says about divorce. Mat. 19:5-6 *For this cause shall a man leave father and mother, and shall cleave to his wife: and they twain shall be one flesh? 6 Wherefore they are no more twain, but one flesh. What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder.* Mal. 2:14 ... *the LORD hath been witness between thee and the wife of thy youth, against whom thou hast dealt treacherously: **yet** is she thy companion, and the wife of thy covenant. 15 And did not he make **one**? Yet had he the residue of the spirit. And wherefore one? That he might seek a godly seed. **Therefore take heed to your spirit, and let none deal treacherously against the wife of his youth.** 16 For the LORD, the God of Israel, saith that he hateth putting away: **for one covereth violence with his garment, saith the LORD of hosts: therefore take heed to your spirit,** that ye deal not treacherously. 17 Ye have wearied the LORD with your words. Yet ye say, Wherein have we wearied him? When ye say, Every one that doeth evil is good in the sight of the LORD, and he delighteth in them; or, Where is the God of judgment?*

These verses apply to everyone. They apply to star athletes. They apply to service members. They apply to members of Congress. They apply to Senators. They apply to Majority Leaders. They apply to Presidential candidates. They apply to Presidents. Bob Dole had a duty to God and to his wife. He broke his oath and was an example of rebellion against God, and announced to all, that God didn't mean what He said. He got that from his father, the devil, when he hissed to Eve, "Ye shall not surely die." Showing the children of rebellion how to call God a liar. This church was always very vocal about this fact, and he hated this church for that. He married Liddy Dole, his second wife (13 years his junior) in 1975. She was also a power broker and served in the U.S. Senate and several presidential administrations. She is a graduate of the Harvard Law School. The inconvenient truth is that a 46-year adulterous marriage to his second wife does not cover over the violence of the breaking of his oath to God and to the wife of his youth, his companion and the wife of his covenant. Bob Dole must now give an account to the Lord Jesus Christ for this. 2 Cor. 5:10 *For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that everyone may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad. 11 Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men; but we are made manifest unto God; and I trust also are made manifest in your consciences.* We were never successful at convincing Mr. Dole of this. But now he understands. He saved his life and was ashamed of Christ. He said in his farewell letter that he hoped to find out if heaven

looked a lot like Kansas. Everyone chuckled when that was read at his funeral. I don't find it funny at all. I think Mr. Dole knows better now than to underestimate God. *De 4:24 For the LORD thy God is a consuming fire, even a jealous God. Mark 8:35 For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; but whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it. 36 For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? 37 Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul? 38 Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.*

4. **God is Not Mad at You** – Shirl and I were recently driving through Houston, Texas. We passed a billboard on a big interstate highway in heavy traffic that said this:

GOD IS NOT MAD AT YOU.  
GOD IS NOT MAD AT YOU.  
GOD IS NOT MAD AT YOU.  
GOD     LOVES     YOU.

I started talking about the utter lack of Biblical support for any of these statements. She nodded blindly – not paying attention. I knew that at that very moment she was tweeting up a storm – like no one was following her. I continued my conversation which was largely to myself. As an aside: sometimes I must sit in the car for up to 5-10 minutes to allow her time to finish her tweet so I can park the car in the garage. I was saying how outnumbered we are, referencing Elijah on Mount Carmel and Micaiah. When society gets so bad and the zeitgeist gets so bad it is as if the prophets of God do not exist. It is a howling wilderness. The prophets of God, not Baal, are outmanned. *Isa 53:1 Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed? Joh 12:38 That the saying of Esaias the prophet might be fulfilled, which he spake, Lord, who hath believed our report? and to whom hath the arm of the Lord been revealed? Ro 10:16 But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Esaias saith, Lord, who hath believed our report?* It is a rhetorical question. The answer is: **NO ONE!** The scriptures don't speak in vain: *Luke 18:8 ...Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?* Another rhetorical question. *Luke 13: 23 Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them, 24 Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able. Mat. 7: 13 Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide*

*is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat: 14 Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.*

Back to my story – I said to her - at that time, in Israel there were hundreds and hundreds of prophets of Baal to the 1 or 2 prophets of God. I got nothing from her. No “amen,” no “you’re right,” nothing. So to “poke the bear” I said – “Well, Micaiah was like just one of 300 prophets of God that told Jehoshaphat and Ahab not to go to Ramoth-gilead. I got nothing – I looked over and there is a glazed over look in her eyes and her thumbs are a blur - flying all over her phone. But sometimes it takes a while for it so sink in – so I waited. Nothing. Finally, I repeated it and then she came to and asked me what I was talking about. I told her to write this story down, so I would remember it for the sermon. Here is how she tells the story. *I shot him a “What you are talking about Willis” look and said “no 300!”* She also wrote and I quote – *“he was bullying me and talked over me so he didn’t hear me. 😊”*

*2 Cor. 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad. 11 Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men; but we are made manifest unto God; and I trust also are made manifest in your consciences. Isa 30:18 And therefore will the LORD wait, that he may be gracious unto you, and therefore will he be exalted, that he may have mercy upon you: **for the LORD is a God of judgment:** blessed are all they that wait for him. Mal 2:17 Ye have wearied the LORD with your words. Yet ye say, Wherein have we wearied him? When ye say, Every one that doeth evil is good in the sight of the LORD, and he delighteth in them; or, **Where is the God of judgment?***

5. **Minor-Attracted** – No, this is not an attraction to coal miners. I heard a new term the other day and almost fell out of my chair. A pedophile is someone who has sex with someone under the age of consent. For the first time, I heard this crime represented as a “minor-attracted person.” Give this 5 or 10 years and it also will blossom into another protected class. This adulterous and sinful generation is always pushing for something. It won’t be LGBTQ, it will be LMGBTQ. Jer. 7:9 *Will ye steal, murder, and commit adultery, and swear falsely, and burn incense unto Baal, and walk after other gods whom ye know not; 10 And come and stand before me in this house, which is called by my name, and say, We are delivered to do all these abominations? 11 Is this*

*house, which is called by my name, become a den of robbers in your eyes? Behold, even I have seen it, saith the LORD.* This society is never satisfied.

### **Duty of Love to Members of the Church**

Now we get to the main course. This is inherently a different type of sermon than I have done before. The focus on the remainder of this sermon and for several more to come is scriptures on how we are to treat our brothers and sisters in Christ. And, let me tell you that in my opinion, this runs deep with God the Father, and the Holy Spirit and God the Son. This exercise was not to drill down on any one verse. This is not about expounding verses. This exercise is about satisfying a curiosity of mine. I have often thought over the years – “why am I once again preaching about brotherly love?” “Why are these elders once again preaching about how we are to treat each other in the church?” I don’t think I have ever intentionally set out to preach on brotherly love, I just keep running into the verses. And it is not as if I can avoid them when they are clearly in my path – like in Romans 12. I am preaching on Romans 12 and there bright as the noonday sun: Rom. 12:9-10 *Let love be without dissimulation.... Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another.* Am I supposed to run from that? God forbid. So, I set out to document, analyze and itemize every scripture in the New Testament that talked about brotherly and sisterly love and how we are supposed to treat one another. And, what I have find out is that this subject is scattered all throughout the New Testament. By my count, this topic is referenced approximately 200 times. I am not talking about “love thy neighbor” or love to all men. I have left those verses out. I am only talking about brotherly love. Someone recently said that these elders focus a lot on internal matters regarding the church. I personally don’t think so. I think we preach on external and internal matters equally. But the reason that we do, is because the topic is covered in one way or another at least 200 times in the New Testament.

Attached is a document entitled: ***Bible Verses Regarding the Church and Duty of Love, to Members of the Church.*** I have broken down these verses into 13 sub-topics. But, if I was only going to have 1 grand topic - it would be the duty to love one another or brotherly and sisterly love. So, when I say I LOVE YOU and the end of a sermon – I mean it. It is not rote to me, and it is not something I take for granted. There is no question that Christ and the New Testament writers had a deep love for the people of

God. And, all of these verses also support the doctrine of the church. Brotherly and sisterly love is integral to the doctrine of the church. For people that think they can sit somewhere out in Timbuktu and only interact with themselves – and everything will be just fine; well, they are wrong. This is not possible. This is denying the doctrine of the church. If the New Testament says 200 times you are to show love in various ways to members of the church this can't be put behind your back, like it is insignificant.

It also puts a new twist on Re 2:4 *Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love.*

We are going to go through these verses so you can take in the scope and number of this topic in the New Testament at the 40,000-foot level. We are going to start specifically with verses that speak to the issue of loving one another or the opposite – hating one another. This is mentioned 56 times in the New Testament in one way or another. It is 48 times + and an extra 8 if you count 1 Cor. 13 by every time charity (another word for love) is mentioned. By my count love one another is referenced specifically in 19 of the 27 books in the New Testament.
